

Drug problem still rife

CANNABIS, inhalant abuse, trans-generational drug and alcohol problems remain prevalent among the region's youth.

Some users are as young as 13.

DAS West Western Health youth outreach team manager Richard Marks says although heroin use is slightly down, many youngsters still do not seek treatment for ecstasy addictions. The service reaches out to

western suburbs youth aged between 10 and 22. It offers counselling for drug, alcohol, mental problems,

violence and sexual abuse. The service's counsellors also make regular school visits in the shire to break down some of the barriers and tell students about the dangers of substance abuse. "We get a lot of referrals from family members who notice their kids are having trouble at school or in their

job and are heading off the rails," Mr Marks said.

"Alcohol continues to be the drug of choice because it's legal and easily accessible.

"There's been a shift away from heroin because of a reduction in supply and the negative consequences associated with it.' The most concerning trend

within Melton shire is transgenerational drug use: both parents and their children are users. "In some situations it's

seen as acceptable by parents," Mr Marks said.

"Some parents are unemployed, isolated and marginalised, and we've even seen cases where it's stretched across three generations.

"It's really up to the parents to seek treatment as well and that's part of our - because we try to job work with the families and determine why their kids are taking drugs in the first place

Mr Marks said a higher pressure on teenagers to succeed in school and in all walks of life -- combined with depression, anxiety and problems at home - often
