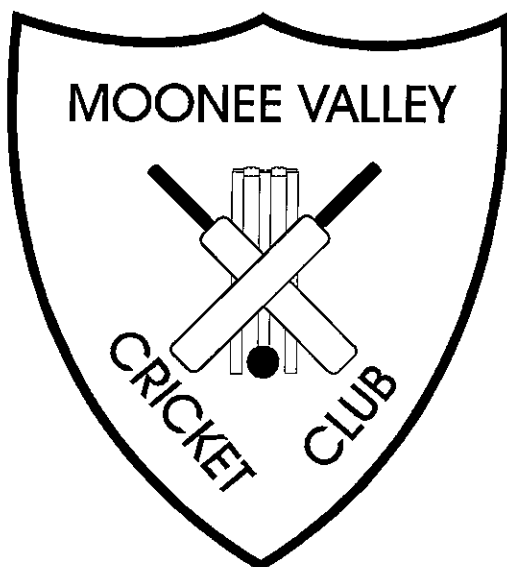

SunSmart Policy

The health of club members is a key concern for the Moonee Valley Cricket Club.

Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world, with two out of three people experiencing some form of skin cancer during their lifetime. It is acknowledged that skin cancer is a preventable disease and that a preventative strategy including the following actions is being implemented and actively encouraged by the Moonee Valley Cricket Club.

- Where possible, and within the strictures of the fixtures produced by the local cricket associations, outdoor events and training times are scheduled outside the hours of 11am and 3 pm (daylight savings time).
- The club maximises the use of natural shade provided from buildings, trees, and other structures.
- Where natural shade does not exist, the club is seeking to provide portable shade structures for use by officials, spectators and players.
- Players and supporters are also encouraged to bring their own shade structures to club events if alternative shade is not provided.
- Moonee Valley encourages and promotes the wearing of sun-protective clothing as part of the uniform or general clothing of players and officials with both adult and junior players.

This includes:

- * Shirts or playing tops which have long sleeves and a collar.
- * Wide brimmed or legionnaires hats whenever practical, as an alternative to the club cap.
- * Sunglasses to protect the eyes.

Sunscreens

- SPF 15+ or higher sunscreens are promoted by the club to players, spectators and officials.
- Prior to training or playing in peak UV periods, players and participants are encouraged to apply sunscreen to exposed body parts.
- The club kiosk makes sunscreens available for sale to members and spectators.

Education

- Moonee Valley will provide skin cancer educational sessions to increase the awareness of this health issue among club members, especially junior players.
- Newsletters and public announcements are used to maintain awareness of the issue and to prompt sun protective behaviour.
- Club officials and staff are encouraged to act as suitable SunSmart role models.

History of junior cricket at Moonee Valley

The Moonee Valley Cricket Club has a proud history of 36 years as a senior Club. The Club regularly won A Grade Premierships in the North West Cricket Association, and more recently in the Moreland-Moonee Valley Cricket Association. Our Firsts and Seconds are now in the Victorian Turf Cricket Association.

The club has also won Premierships in the lower senior grades in the Associations in which we have played.

We are now entering our 12th season with the juniors.

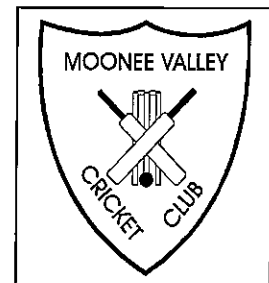
In 1996, Moonee Valley Cricket Club in conjunction with a group of local parents set out to establish junior cricket for young people from Moonee Ponds, Ascot Vale, West Brunswick, West Coburg and surrounding districts.

The Club commenced with an Under 10 team and an Under 12 side in 1996/97. With solid promotion of the sport by the Club in local schools and throughout the surrounding suburbs, our junior section has now grown to the extent that in the 2006/07 season just concluded, Moonee Valley fielded three Under 10 teams, four Under 12 teams, three Under 14 teams, one Under 16 team and a girls' Under 14 team. We won two Premierships – in the Under 16s and the Under 12 Green team, and most of our players experienced finals.

We have planned for an increase in our number of teams in 2007/08, with the possibility of extra Under 16, Under 14, Under 10 and girls teams.

Most of our junior cricket is played on Saturday mornings, although we are also a pioneer in the North West Cricket Association in playing Sunday morning home fixtures.

We have our home bases at Ormond Park (Under 16, Under 14 and Under 12 teams), Debney Park (Under 16, Under 14 and Under 12 teams) and Moonee Ponds Central School (Under 12s). Our Under 10s and Under 14 girls play Friday evening home games at Ormond Park.



The Under 10s play on Sunday mornings up to the start of Daylight Saving, and on Friday evenings throughout the rest of the season. The Under 14 Girls play Friday nights, with the season commencing after Daylight Saving starts.

Our innovative junior development program has also produced a number of young players who have performed meritoriously in senior ranks, and so helped to ensure a healthy future for our Club.

Moonee Valley has a policy of giving our Under 16 players a taste of senior cricket before they end their junior playing days. The Club keeps spare spots in the senior teams, which are offered to Under 16 players on a rotational basis to give them experience. This means that when they finish their junior days, these players already know that they have the skills and ability to compete in senior ranks. Many of our Under 14s also benefit from this senior exposure.

Season's Subscription Fees

Subscription fees for junior players for the 2007/08 season have been set at \$140 per child. This fee incorporates GST and our requirement to be members of the Moonee Valley Sporting Club as well as the Moonee Valley Cricket Club.

The Sporting Club component of our fees for a junior player is \$25, while for an extra \$35 the whole family can enjoy the benefits of Sporting Club membership. The Sporting Club's bylaws require that anyone who uses our Club facilities more than three times in a year must be a member, so we strongly encourage that players and their families subscribe to the \$60 family package rather than the \$25 individual.

*Our cricket subscription payment covers a range of direct junior section costs, such as purchase of match and training balls, purchase and replacement of Club kits (bats, pads, gloves, protectors, etc, which are available for all junior players to use), umpire fees, scorebooks, insurance, trophies and Association affiliation fees. **We would seek to have all payments finalised by November 20.***

There are discounts available if families have two or more children playing with our junior section (\$110 per child for second and subsequent children), for families with an eligible health or concession card (\$110 per child) including GST, and for players and families who have already paid the Sporting Club fee through football.

*Our Cricket Subscription payments also cover Club-wide costs, such as the maintenance and running costs of facilities such as our clubrooms, and the ongoing development of the Moonee Valley Cricket Club. Our cricket subscription fees do **not** directly cover the rental we pay on Ormond Park and other grounds or a contribution to overall costs as a section of the Moonee Valley Sporting Club, including items such as electricity, gas, phone, rates and public liability insurance.*

Our players are required to be members of our parent body, the Moonee Valley Sporting Club so that they can contribute to these club-wide costs, play under its banner and legally utilise the licensed premises at both the match-day pavilion and the bowling rooms.

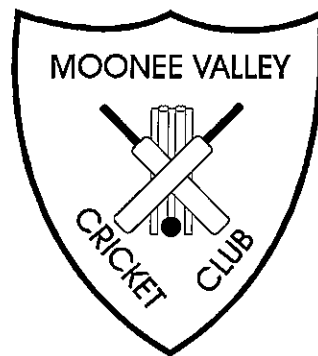
*The Moonee Valley Sporting Club has set its fees at \$45 per year (including GST) for Adult players. All members of a family – Mum, Dad and the kids – are encouraged to sign up as Sporting Club members, and in such cases total subscriptions for the family are capped at \$60 (including GST). The Cricket Club strongly encourages families of junior players to join the Sporting Club under the Family Cap plans. **Our cricket subscription incorporates the \$25 junior player fee.***

If a member of your family plays in another section of our club – the football or lawn bowls – you may already have current Sporting Club membership. This can be checked for you.

*Moonee Valley Cricket Club has a policy that at our end-of-season presentation nights, **EVERY** child receives a trophy.*

Fundraisers – and our Chocolate Drive

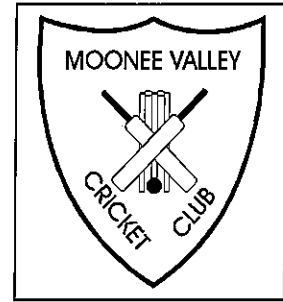
Our season's subscription fees at best bring us to around break-even for the cost of running the junior section of our Cricket Club.

We depend on parent and family support for some of our other activities to ensure that we generate the funds for our Club to continue to function – both at a senior and junior level.

So please keep in mind the need to support the Club functions we hold throughout the season, such as the Christmas raffle, the Junior Trivia Night and our presentation nights, and to support the Club canteen whenever it's operating.

*One of our main all-of-club fundraisers is the Chocolate Drive, and **every** family will receive a box to sell. They will be distributed via the team managers to the players – both junior and senior – so please look out for it.*

Moonee Valley Cricket Club Code Of Conduct



All players are expected to train and play in a cooperative and team-oriented manner at all times. This will enable players and their team mates to:

- *improve their knowledge and understanding of the traditions of the game;*
- *continue to hone their cricketing skills;*
- *support and guide their team mates; and,*
- *improve their enjoyment and participation in the game of cricket.*

Uncooperative, disruptive or unsportsmanlike behaviour will not be tolerated at any time.

To ensure all players conduct themselves in an appropriate manner, the Junior Committee has established the following Code Of Conduct. The Code of Conduct will apply to any player who is deemed to have been behaving in a fashion contrary to the above requirements.

First Offence

The player will be asked to immediately stop behaving in the offending manner. Should a player not immediately and completely comply with this request the player will be restricted to fielding duties for the balance of that day in addition to being restricted to fielding duties for a full day's play the next week. This will mean not batting, bowling or wicketkeeping.

Second Offence

The player's parent[s] and/or guardian[s] will be contacted and advised that the player will be suspended for a period of two match days – irrespective of whether the two-day suspension covers one or two games.

Third Offence

The player and his parent[s] and/or guardian[s] will be provided the opportunity to meet with the Junior Committee and show cause why the player should remain at the Club. The Junior Committee in its absolute discretion will then adjudicate as to the player's future association with the Club. In the event a player is released from the Club no fees will be refunded.

The Junior Committee has prepared this document in good faith to enable our juniors to play their cricket in the spirit in which it is intended and to provide a fair and transparent process with which to manage any transgressions

The Club asks parents to carefully read the Junior Player Handbook, and to acknowledge our policies – such as our Code of Conduct and our team merit selection policy. Please acknowledge by signing and returning this form.

Some general advice.....

Club kits – the club provides full kits for each of our teams – comprising batting pads, batting gloves, helmets, thigh pads, wicketkeeping pads, wicketkeeping gloves and groin protector ‘boxes’. Most kits also have one or two bats.

Many players prefer to have their own equipment, but the club kits have everything required for those players who wish to utilise them.

Helmets – Moonee Valley Cricket Club was in the forefront in making the wearing of helmets compulsory for our young players while batting. Our Junior Committee adopted this policy out of concern for the need to protect our players from potential injury.

We have helmets in each team’s kit. The North West Cricket Association has now also adopted a policy requiring helmets for all age groups, including Under 10s, and for wicketkeepers in Under 10s and Under 12s.

Boxer shorts – boxers are popular underwear these days – but they’re not suitable for cricket. Players need to wear jockettes, y-fronts or other similar tight-fitting underwear so they can fit in their groin protector.

The loose-fitting nature of boxer shorts doesn’t enable the “box” to fit comfortably, and in the event of a knock with the cricket ball, it can be a very painful and unpleasant experience. So remember – for your own comfort, no boxers at training or match days.

A “fair go” for players – Moonee Valley Cricket Club is committed to enabling all our players to develop as cricketers to the best of their ability and at their own pace.

At all levels of juniors we seek to give our players the opportunity to both bat and bowl, and juggle the batting order so that the same players are not always batting last. Particularly in our “formative” grades of Under 10 and Under 12, policies are in place to ensure everyone gets a reasonable go.

Girls playing with the boys – girls who feel confident are also encouraged to further develop their cricket skills by playing with the boys, and our Club is happy to assist. As a result of a submission by our Moonee Valley Cricket Club, girls can now play “above their age” in all North West Cricket Association junior grades.

This means that girls who are still aged 13 as of September 1 can play with our boys in Under 12s, girls still aged 15 as of September 1 can play with our boys in Under 14s and girls still aged 17 as of September 1 can play in Under 16s.

Given that our girls teams play on Friday evenings, interested girls can “double up” and also play with the boys’ teams on Saturday mornings, at no extra fee.

Girls interested in this concept should talk to Junior Co-ordinator Charlie Walker or their coach, and then try their hand at training with the boys’ squads to assess their confidence and gauge their relative performance levels.

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## Our regular Junior Newsletter

*Moonee Valley Cricket Club publishes newsletter information for junior players and parents on a regular basis. Important information is distributed via email, posted on the website and handed to players on training nights or playing days.*

*Newsletters are for the player "and Family", so ask your child from time to time whether they have received one.*

*Information is designed to keep players and parents informed on what's happening within our Club, how our teams are travelling, key dates and activities during the season and requests for help or information.*

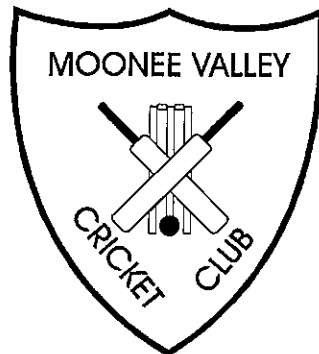

## Player insurance

*The Club provides injury insurance for junior and senior players through a scheme recommended by Cricket Australia.*

***Mouthguards** are recommended by our club and by many junior sporting bodies as a way to help prevent dental injuries. A number of Moonee Valley's junior coaches have either completed the Cricket Victoria Level 1 coaching accreditation course, or are to do it this season. Advice on injury prevention is an important part of these courses.*

*In the event of other mishaps on our grounds, the Moonee Valley Sporting Club's public liability insurance would come into play. All clubs in the North West Cricket Association are required to demonstrate that they have current public liability cover, so mishaps when we are playing on other clubs' grounds should also be under cover.*





# Moonee Valley Cricket Club Dress Code

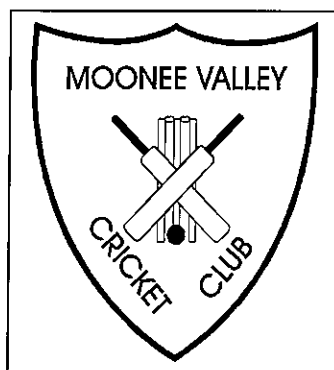
*Players are representing the Moonee Valley Cricket Club, and are our public face. The Club wants all players to look and act professionally.*

*We strongly urge all players to observe our dress code, which is designed to ensure that they look smart, professional, and part of a team in which they have pride. However it is a voluntary code, and there are no issues if families or players are not in a position to comply.*

*Club caps are available for sale at \$15 each, and can be bought through the canteen, the Junior Co-ordinator or Team Managers. Wide-brimmed hats with our Club logo are available at \$12.*

*We strongly urge players on the field to at all times wear either a Moonee Valley Club cap, or a wide-brimmed white hat for sun protection.*

*Players should wear a **white or cream shirt and white or cream trousers.***



*On cooler days, players should wear a white or cream jumper or top over their shirt. If they don't have this type of top, they should consider an extra shirt or t-shirt underneath.*

*What we are seeking to avoid is the situation where players representing our Club take to the field with jumpers and tops in a wide variety of colors, and a wide range of cap colors. There was nothing to identify them as Moonee Valley players, or as team-mates. If the players are representing our Moonee Valley Cricket Club, we want them to take pride in our Club and look like Club cricketers.*

*Our Club has a selection of cricket pants, shirts and jumpers with our Club logo emblazoned on them. These are available through the canteen, Junior Co-ordinator or Team Managers. Prices range from \$20 to \$25 for the shirts and trousers, and around \$45 for the jumpers and vests.*

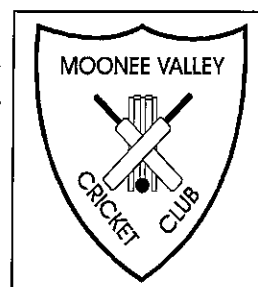
*There are also Club socks with our Club name on them, for \$5 per pair or three pairs for \$12.*

# Junior Team selection policy

*Since the Junior Section of the Moonee Valley Sporting Club was established in 1996, we have used a selection system which has given preference to placing players within their friendship groups.*

*This system continues for most of our teams. However, given our player numbers and the ongoing skills development of our players, in 2006/07 for the first time we selected our highest-ranked team ONLY in Under 12s and Under 14s on merit and skills. The policy continues.*



*This means that players who at a higher stage in their skills and development will be more likely to be in our top-graded team, and that all players in the age group, as they progress and perform, will be eligible for consideration for that team.*

*All other teams in each age group will continue to be put together on the basis of friendship groups, or with an emphasis on first-year or second-year players being placed together.*

*Players from the highest-ranked team who may be struggling with form or who may be squeezed out from time to time by a better-performing player will be able to revert to their friendship group.*

## Specialist coaching

*Moonee Valley Cricket Club has again engaged the services of specialist coach Lyndsay Walker to help with our junior development.*

*Lyndsay played seven seasons with UK County club Nottinghamshire, and was assistant coach there for three seasons.*

*He also coached the Malaysian national team for a year, spent five years as assistant coach of the Victorian women's team and coached Premier side Richmond.*

*Lyndsay has been engaged to run a number of specialist training sessions with our juniors at no extra cost to the players.*

*He also runs his own holiday clinics and specialist one-on-one sessions as part of his own coaching and training company – many of them at Ormond Park. Anyone wanting to engage Lyndsay's services privately can ring him for more details and prices on 0419 730 352.*

# Parent roster

*We have parent rosters to help on match-days with the junior teams. We will expect that a parent will be able to take on a role on two or three match days with their child's team over the course of the season.*

*We must of course remember that most of our volunteer coaches and team managers have taken on their role primarily because they are parents as well – or in the case of some of our younger coaches, they have graduated from the junior ranks where they were supported by their own parents in past years.*

*Tasks for parents could include taking charge of the Club equipment for the duration of the day's play, helping the players warm up before going out to bat or bowl, making sure the players have plenty of fluids to drink, ensuring they have all put on sunscreen, or helping with transport.*

*Other tasks may include helping out at the canteen if your child's team is playing at Ormond Park.*

*Key tasks involved with the running of a cricket team are scoring, umpiring and assisting the coaches in preparing the players.*

*The Club is happy to teach parents the rudiments of scoring and umpiring, so that they can confidently take on these roles if required.*

*We will approach families before the start of the season to ascertain where they can help, and try to select dates that suit for parents to come and assist.*

*If games are called off, there will be a recorded message on an NWCA number, **9539 4844.***

*A decision on Saturday morning games will be made by 7am, and if the games are to be called off a message will be posted from that time. Decisions will be made and messages posted by 3.30pm for Friday evening games, and 8.30am for Sunday morning games.*

*Parents should ring this NWCA number in preference to their team coach to ascertain if matches are on. The same process occurs on days when extreme heat is forecast.*

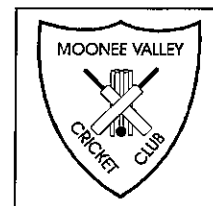

# Pathway to Senior Cricket

*The Moonee Valley Cricket Club sees our Junior Section as a vital pathway to senior cricket.*

*It's surprising how quickly the youngsters running around in the Under 10s progress through the age groups, and before you know it are ready, willing and able to play senior cricket.*

*All of our young players are given the opportunity to test themselves either regularly or occasionally in senior ranks before they complete their journey as a junior at the end of the Under 16s – our last grade of junior cricket.*



*And almost all of our juniors offered that opportunity have taken it, and proved that they have the skill, ability and application to mix it with adults in the seniors.*

*Our policies have led to Moonee Valley Cricket Club adding extra teams at a senior level in recent seasons – at a time when many other Clubs are struggling for numbers, or merging or folding.*

*One of our innovations at the start of the 2005/06 season, when our sheer weight of numbers meant we needed to field an extra team, was the introduction of our Under 18 squad – which was hailed a major success, and is an initiative which other Clubs are now looking at.*

*With experienced, senior players and coaches in charge as captain and vice-captain, our recent graduates and our Under 16 players were offered the opportunity to play together as a squad in senior ranks as our "Under 18 Development Team". The teens really took it up to the adults at the other Clubs, and the initiative will stand them in good stead as they work their way through our higher grades as their career progresses.*

*Another of Moonee Valley's innovations has been our one-day teams, which have a strong representation from dads of our juniors. One of VicHealth's priority target groups is older inactive males, and we're pleased to say that we've been able to get some of our over-50s dads – and younger ones as well – out on the park playing cricket as their healthy reintroduction to sport. Many of them have been able to play official, competitive games with their sons when the boys have been given the opportunity to try out in senior ranks. Dads don't have to commit to a full season or to play every week – we structure our one-day squads to meet the needs of players who have availability problems or who want to ease back into competitive sport.*

*An innovation for 2007/08 is the entry of a Moonee Valley women's team in the one-day competition of the Victorian Women's Cricket Association. Its core comprises a group of our club mums, and a pathway for our girls coming through the Under 14s.*

*Many of our junior coaches are involved in our one-day teams – so if dads are interested they should ring junior co-ordinator **Charlie Walker** or see some of the coaches – including **Steven Ball**, **Kevin Gardiner**, **Phill King**, **Domenic Chiera** or **Allan Cumming** – who have already made the step. Interested mums should see Charlie or Phill.*

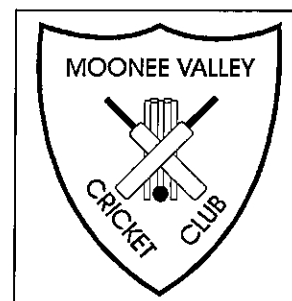

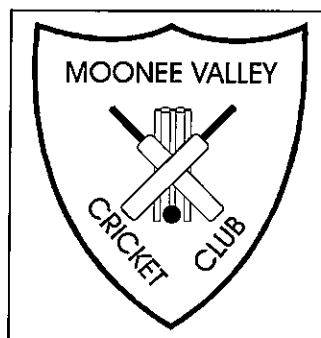

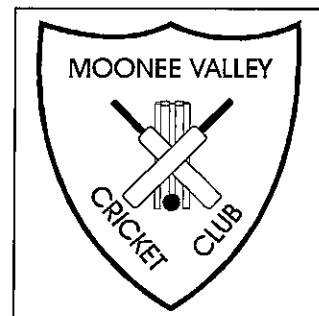
# Support our Club functions
